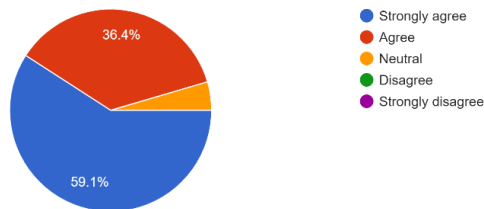


Results of our SRE (Sex and Relationship Education) Consultation to parents.

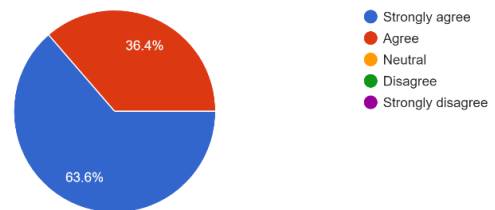

Here are the results from the questionnaire:

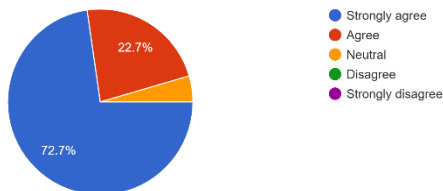
PSHE/RSE topics taught in school can make a real difference to young people's lives

100% of parents understood and agreed with the content in the SRE policy and were aware of the topics that would be covered in SRE/ PSHE in each year group.

Thank you to the parents that suggested things we could add to our SRE/ PSHE policy. These are the great ideas they suggested with related comments in brackets:

- CPR and first aid, which would seem to fit in with Health education and be rather important. (We are planning to teach this in the summer term, there will be an age related set of objectives for each year group to focus on. Resuscitation will be taught in Year 6.)
- LGBT to avoid prejudices, create a world of acceptance and put those at ease that may feel different. (This will be taught alongside the SRE lessons when we look at different relationships and families.)
- There is a reference to democracy and economy, it would be wonderful if this was taught under the umbrella of doughnut economics (Kate Raworth) - which looks at everything that is important for communities to thrive - doughnut economics action lab <https://www.kateraworth.com/deal/> (We will look into this resource and see how we can combine it with our lessons on democracy and the economy.)
